Number of pupils on roll	214

Percentage of school population with Pupil Premium entitlement	3.74%
Total Pupil Premium funding received	£15,840

The percentage of the school roll with Pupil Premium entitlement is very low. The purpose of the Pupil Premium grant is to support those pupils with entitlement by seeking to narrow gaps in attainment. It also enables schools to ensure fair and equal access to curricular and extra-curricular learning opportunities. In 2015-2016 the grant has been used to pay for or contribute towards the cost of support, interventions and services.

Nature of support 2015/2016
Individual teaching before school for one pupil, 30 minutes per week for 1.5 terms
After-school homework club, one hour per week for the whole school year
Contribution towards the cost of Rainbows programme
Part funding of teaching assistant time for intervention groups with individuals and small groups
Subsidised educational visits, ensuring access for all

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Impact on attainment

The pupils with Pupil Premium entitlement who reached the end of Key Stage 2 in July 2016 made **greater progress** over the course of Key Stage 2 and **achieved better** than pupils without Pupil Premium entitlement.

Pupil Progress from end of KS1 to end of KS2

Expected standardised score is calculated using average points scores from the end of Key Stage 1. A difference of zero between expected and actual score means that a child achieved exactly the expected standardised score. The range of possible standardised scores at the end of Key Stage 2 is 40 points, so it can be seen that all the differences (plus or minus) in the table below are very small.

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Pupil progress within year

The progress of all pupils in the school is tracked using a points system, based on the end of year expectations for each year group. Progress of more than 6 points is greater than expected progress. The table shows that progress of pupils with Pupil Premium is markedly better than the school average in reading and writing, and is broadly the same in maths.

Future plans

In 2016-2017 it is intended to use Pupil Premium funding to train two members of staff in delivering Fischer Family Trust intervention, and for the cost of resourcing it.

Teaching assistants will continue to be allocated to support individual pupils with Pupil Premium entitlement.

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
